

Do you use the Internet? If you do, you should learn  $\textcircled{1}(\underline{\phantom{0}})(\underline{\phantom{0}})$  use it as a smart searcher. Here are some ideas to help you find the information you need ( A ) the Internet.

- 1. Use more than one keyword to find better results. ②(\_\_\_\_)(\_\_\_), if you want to find information about apples, put 'fruit apples' in the search box, not just 'apples', because 'apples' may also be the name for other things.
- 2. Use specific words or phrases. If you are looking (B) information about "why apples are red", use quotation marks ("") and type that phrase between them. Then, only exact matches will be ③(show).
- 3. Check your spelling. Make sure that you spell every word in the search box correctly. Even if you make only one typing mistake, you will not get the results you want. Also, you don't need words like "a" or "the" because they aren't usually helpful.
- 4. Look at different websites and compare the information written there. You should look at who made the websites, and when they were updated, ④ (\_\_\_\_\_)(\_\_\_\_). If you read several websites, you will find ⑤[you / trust / which / can / information]. By doing so, you will get accurate and recent information.
- <u>6</u>These simple steps can help you find what you want (A) the Internet. However, you have to be careful when you use it. Finding good information is not always easy. Don't make the mistake of believing everything you read online. Always ask yourself, "Can I trust this information?" If you <u>7</u>do so, the Internet will be a powerful tool in your life.

"Never limit yourself." Mae Jemison said these words to encourage others to follow their dreams. Mae is a scientist, a doctor, and the first African American woman to go into space. She worked hard to make her dreams come true even when things were difficult.

Mae was born in 1956 in Alabama, USA, and she was the youngest of three children. Her father worked as a handyman and her mother taught math and English at an elementary school. When Mae was three, her family moved to Chicago, Illinois. There, she was introduced to science by her uncle. She loved it so much that she decided to become a scientist when she grew up. In addition to science, she loved the TV show Star Trek and became interested in going to space as an astronaut. She also enjoyed reading in the library for hours.

One day, Mae said to her teacher, "I want to be a scientist in the future." Then, Mae's teacher asked, "You mean you want to be a nurse, right?" The teacher thought that women and African American people did not have many chances to do scientific jobs. However, Mae did what she wanted to do, and she studied science.

Mae worked hard in school, but her teachers did not support her very much. They didn't think she would be successful. However, her parents always encouraged her to do her best. In 1973, when Mae was 16 years old, she received a scholarship to attend Stanford University, one of the best universities in the United States. But, at university, Mae experienced discrimination from her classmates, and even from teachers, because she was an African American. But this made her want to do her best even more.

After four years, Mae graduated from Stanford University, but this was not enough for her. After Stanford, she went on to Cornell University to study medicine. While at Cornell, she traveled to different countries to help refugees. After four years, she started working as a doctor. She also joined the United States Peace Corps to work as a volunteer doctor.

In 1985, Mae returned to the US and decided to follow her other dream to become an astronaut. She applied for the NASA astronaut training program, and was chosen from a group of around two thousand people. Her space mission took place in 1992 on the Space Shuttle Endeavour. Mae stayed in space for 190 hours 30 minutes 23 seconds. Mae's trip to space was a significant achievement for herself, for women, and for people of color who needed more support for careers in science.

Mae said, "Never limit yourself because of others' limited imagination; never limit others because of your own limited imagination." She made her dreams come true even though she had many difficulties. Listen to your heart and find what you really want to do. Do your best to make your dreams come true even when others say, "It's impossible." Your future is limitless, so reach for the stars!
